20TH ANNIVERSARY OF 911

The 20th anniversary of the September 11th 2001 terrorist attacks will be marked with the traditional reading of victims' names – the 2,983 men, women, and children killed, as well as the 1993 bombing of the World Trade Center. Six moments of silence mark the times when each of the World Trade Center towers was struck, when each tower fell, and the times corresponding to the attack at the Pentagon, and the crash of United Airlines Flight 93 in Pennsylvania. Commemorations will also include the Tribute in Light, consisting of two beams of light evoking the twin towers destroyed in the attack. Learn more about the event.
